## Birdlist for San Jose km 34 Biological Station (520 masl. S 06°25.34' W 76°17.32')

This list is the result from a visit to the station 28.3-2.4 2005 by Roger Ahlman (rahlman2002@yahoo.se). All birding was done by foot from the station and this list *does not* include birds from the tunnel-area of the Yurimaguas road. It should be noted that the overall birding activity in the forest was very poor with very few birds singing. Surely this area must have much more to offer.

The Quebrada trail. Cross the river from the station and walk up in the quebrada. Partly through good forest but on return mostly through chacras.

The Restaurant trail. This trail goes uphill east of the road not far from the restaurant at km 33. A tough trail that goes straight up and steep.

Samaipampa trail. This trail starts about 1.5 kms south of the station and crosses the river (difficult). Muddy and uphill through chacras but on return through better forest.

The Mirador. About 3 kms south of the station the road makes a 90° left-turn around a cliff. In this turn there is a small rocky out-crop from where there is a good view. A 'clay-lick' is viewable from here.
